● About PAVILION TOKYO 2021

PAVILION TOKYO 2021 is organized by the Tokyo Metropolitan Government, Arts Council Tokyo (Tokyo Metropolitan Foundation for History and Culture), and Executive Committee of Pavilion Tokyo 2021, as a part of Tokyo Tokyo FESTIVAL Special 13. This project is a world-first experiment to propose unrestrained and new urban landscape by installing architectures or objects at locations mainly around the National Stadium. Like a treasure hunt with map or during a walk, visitors can go around the pavilions in which the globally renowned architects and artists express one's hope for the future. Living Tokyo - Since some time ago, Tokyo has been undergoing a number of major area remodeling projects called redevelopment. Everywhere has been transformed into something convenient and clean, and we are receiving many benefits and enjoying a rich life there. On the other hand, as a graduate of Shibuya Aoyama Elementary School, I still have memories of Toden (Tokyo streetcar train) that used to run along Aoyama street proudly, the empty wide sky around the former "Kodomo no Shiro (Children's Castle)" where the Toden garage used to be, and the frightening memories of post-war sadness around Shibuya station. The city always had such memorable scenes in it. In fact, this project, PAVILION TOKYO 2021, aims to create a new story of the city. It is the summer 2021, a year in which the world is changing dramatically under the pandemic. In that year, the mysterious pavilions that could not possibly exist will appear in the city of Tokyo, and if the scenes shall reach even a small part of the minds of many people, this project will be a great success. During the 67 days of the exhibition, we hope you will experience the "living Tokyo."

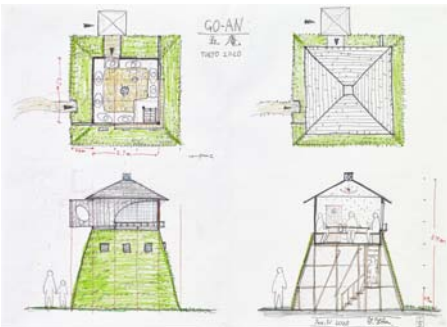

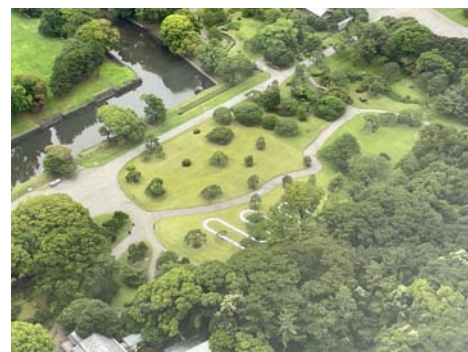

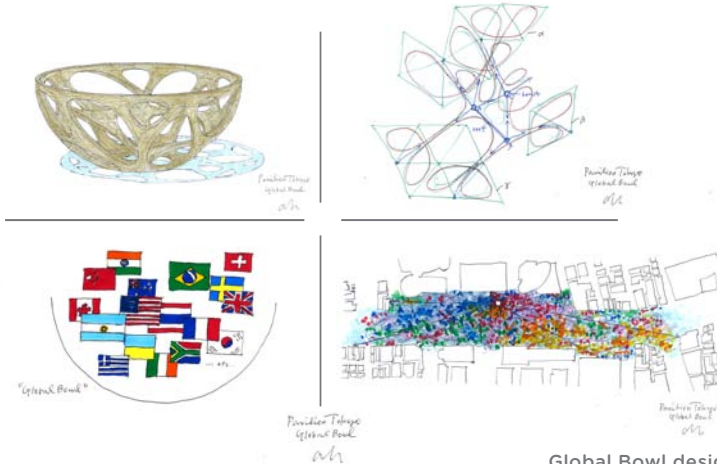

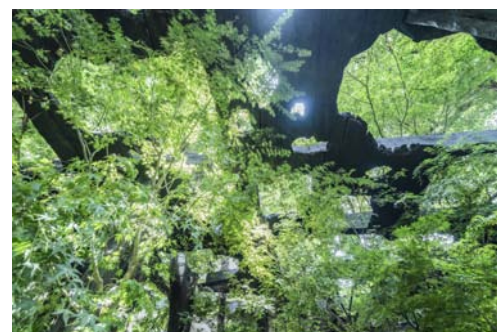

The pavilion is like a garden in an alley, where people and plants are organically woven together.

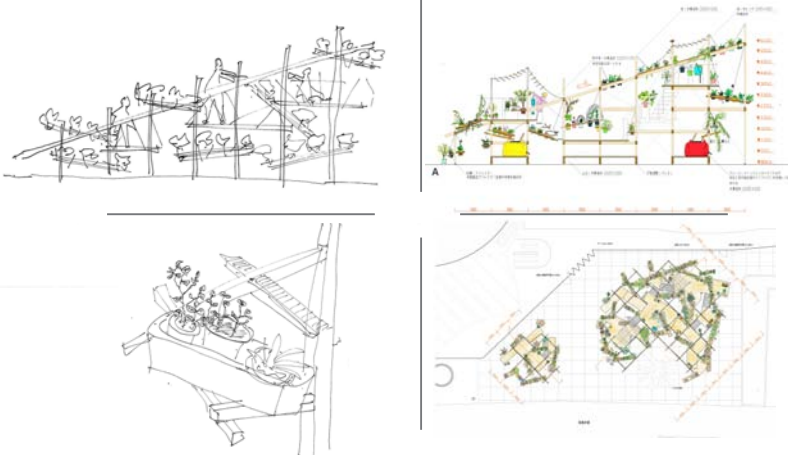

Born in 1946. He got his PhD from the University of Tokyo. Now he is a director of Edo Tokyo Museum, a professor emeritus of the University of Tokyo, and a professor of Kogakuin University. After a long career as a researcher of modern architectural history and urban history, he debuted as an architect with Jinchokan Moriya Historical Museum in 1991, when he was 45 years old. He creates architectures in which nature and artifacts integrate. "Team Jomon Architecture," consisted of amateurs, sometimes helps to construct his work. His representative works are Tanpopo House (Dandelion House), Nira House (Leek House), Takasugi-an Tea House, and more. Recently he completed Mosaic-tile-Museum Tajimi and Kusayane and Douyane in La Collina Omi-Hachiman.

Sejima

Born in 1956. She got her master's degree from Japan Women's University. She established Kazuyo Sejima & Associates in 1987 and SANAA with Ryue Nishijima in 1995. She often uses acrylic and metal materials and makes space and people connecting loosely. Their representative works are 21st Century Museum of Contemporary Art, The New Museum of Contemporary Art in New York, Le Louvre-Lens, The Sumida Hokusai Museum (as Kazuyo Sejima & Associates) and her latest work Department of Art Science at Osaka University of Arts (as Kazuyo Sejima & Associates). In 2010, she was appointed director of architecture sector for the Venice Biennale as the first Japanese and female director. SANAA got many prizes including the AIJ Prize, the Golden Lion for the most remarkable work at the 12th Venice Biennale in 2004, the Pritzker Prize in 2010, and Sejima got Medal with Purple Ribbon in 2016.

Born in 1971. He started Sou Fujimoto Architects in 2000, soon after his graduation from the Faculty of Engineering at the University of Tokyo with a degree in architecture. His representative works are Musashino Art University Museum & Library, Serpentine Gallery Pavilion 2013 in London, L'Arbre Blanc in Montpellier, France, and his latest work SHIROIYA HOTEL. He was selected as a winner of several international competitions; the Ecole Polytechnique Learning Centre in Paris in 2015, and the Reinventing Paris project in Pershing/Porte Maillot in 2016. He is the Expo site design producer for the 2025 Japan International Exposition (Osaka/Kansai Expo).

Born in 1971. He got his master's degree from Kyoto University in 1997. After working for Toyo Ito & Associates, Architects, established his own office, Akihisa Hirata Architecture Office in 2005. Now he is a professor of Kyoto University. His representative works are Kotoriku, Art Museum & Library, Ota, and 9h nine hours. He is working on the exterior and rooftop design for the Jingumae 6-chome Urban Redevelopment Project, scheduled for completion in 2022. He got many prizes; the 19th JIA Newface Award, Elita Design Award (Photosynthesis), the Golden Lion at the 13th Venice Biennale in 2012 and more. He participated in an exhibition, Japanese Constellation in MoMA in 2016.

Born in 1974. He acquired his master's degree in architecture and planning at Tokyo National University of Fine Arts and Music in 2000. After working in Kazuyo Sejima & Associates, he established his own firm in 2004: junya.ishigami+associates. He worked as a part time instructor at Tokyo University of Science, an associate professor at Tohoku University, and the Kenzo Tange Design Critic at the Harvard Graduate School of Design from 2014. His representative work is the Kanagawa Institute of Technology KAIT Workshop, Water Garden in Art Biotop Nasu, and Serpentine Pavilion 2019. He got many prizes; AIJ Prize for Architectural Design in 2009, and the Golden Lion for Best Project at the 12th Venice Architecture Biennale in 2010. He held a large-scale exhibition "Junya Ishigami, Freeing Architecture" in Fondation Cartier pour l'art contemporain in 2018.

Born in 1975. He got his master degree from the Yokohama National University. Before he established his own firm, FUJIWALABO in 2009, he had worked in Kengo Kuma & Associates from 2001 and designed many projects in more than twenty cities in the world; Tiffany Ginza, Sanlitun Soho in Beijing, Asakusa Culture Tourist Information Center, FRAC Marseille, and more. He also acts as a director of a NPO Drifters International from 2010 and an assistant professor of Y-GSA at Yokohama National University from 2012. His practices cross the border between architecture and other fields including art, theater and urban scale matters. His representative works are KURKKU FIELDS, Nasushiobara Community Center Kururu, Inamura House and Gardens, and venue design for Reborn-Art Festival 2017.

Born in 1965. He got his master's degree in Fine Arts from the Tokyo National University of Fine Arts. He often uses pretty young girls, war and office workers as his motifs. He comes and goes freely between society and history, current time and pre-modern period, west and east and presents an unexpected contrast and a caustic criticism. He gains overwhelming support from people in all generation. He has a wide range of works not only paintings, but also sculpture, performance, films, novels and manga. His representative exhibitions are "Bye Bye Kitty!!! Between Heaven and Hell in Contemporary Japanese Art" (Japan Society, New York, 2011), "Monument for Nothing" (Mori Art Museum, Tokyo, 2012), "GROUND NO PLAN" (Aoyama Crystal Building, Tokyo, 2018).

Yayoi
Kusama

Born in 1929. She has experienced visions and auditory hallucinations from an early age, and began to draw polka dots and net patterns as motifs. In 1957, she moved to United States by herself and discovered an artistic philosophy of self-obliteration through obsessive repetition and multiplication of a single motif, and established herself as an avantgarde artist by developing a diverse range of works including net paintings, soft sculptures, environmental sculptures using mirrors and electric lights, and happenings. In addition to her artistic activities, she has also published a number of novels and poems. Her representative works include Infinity Net, Dots Obsession, Pumpkin, and My Eternal Soul. She is one of the most important Japanese artists, continuing to work energetically in and outside Japan today. In 2017, She held a large retrospective exhibition "My Eternal Soul" (The National Art Center, Tokyo) and in the same year, the Yayoi Kusama Museum opened in Shinjuku, Tokyo.
